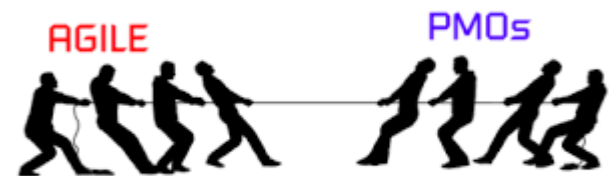


PMO – A little bit of history

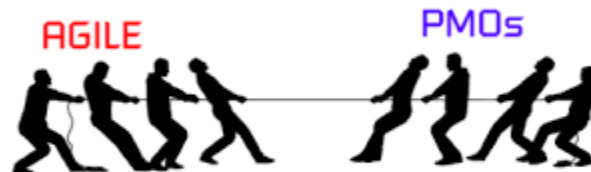

- Self fulfilling

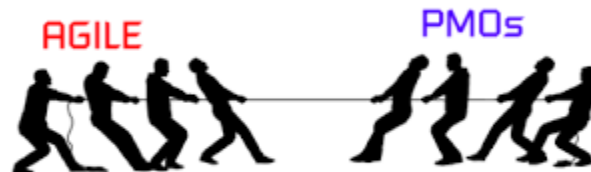


PMO – An Agile Approach

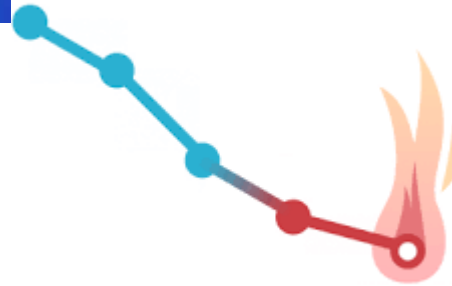

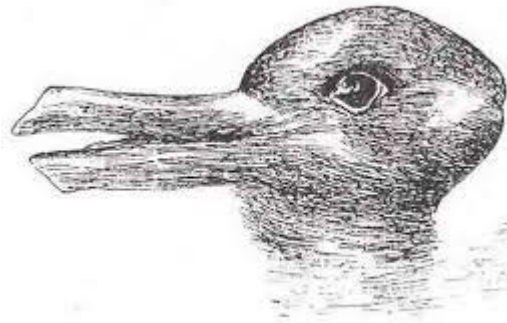
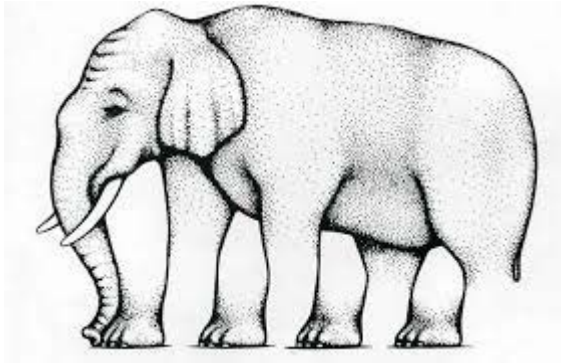
